The camp was inaugurated by the District Governor Lion T. R. Jain and speeches were given by Hon'ble Guest Lieutenant Governor Lion Parshotam Puri, Lion C. D. Shah, LS. Kaval Rekhi, Lion Vaman Mehta, Lion

The following activities were carried out at the camp site :

1. Medical check - up was done in ONE HUNDRED AND EIGHT FIVE persons and those who were found necessary to have a further E.C.G. check up were advised to do on the spot.
2. Surgical check up was done in SIXTY EIGHT cases and the deserving patients were given treatment and surgical advise and reference notes.
3. THIRTY FOUR were checked for their E.N.T. problems and were given proper advise and treatment.
4. 'ALERT INDIA' Association for Leprosy Education Rehabilitation and treatment took charge of the Dermatology Department and checked FIFTY EIGHT persons for their skin problems. Out of which THREE cases were found to be positive. They had exhibited the anti - leprosy posters for public information.
5. THREE HUNDRED AND SIX patients were checked for Ophthalmic problems by expert optician & suitable spectacles with frames were provided on the spot free of cost while the cost price was subsidised by the sponsorers. Guidance was given for patients whose ailment were in advanced stage and required surgery to be done in the hospital.
6. Screening was done in NINETY FIVE persons out of which ONE was found to be positive. The screening machine in Family Welfare Clinic - cum - Ambulance was used to great advantage.
7. Blood Grouping was done in ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY FIVE

8. Immunisation for typhoid, cholera, triple tetanus toxide and polio. FORTY THREE cases and immunisation cards were issued.

**Observation :** NINE HUNDRED AND FORTY FOUR persons took advantage of this activity. Most of them belonged to the middle and lower income group. Some were the students of Somaiya College itself. Others from nearby colony and hutment areas. Most of them suffered from chronic common ailments, infections and under nourishment and general disabilities. Some of them took their prescriptions for getting medicines from outside.

The camp activity was carried out till 4.15 p.m. Thereafter all the doctors dispersed with full job satisfaction. The public showed their gratitude and expressed their desire that such camps may be held in future and all the doctors will co - operate in the same way.
