The following activites were carried out at the camp site:

Medical check - up was done in ONE HUNDRED AND EIGHT FIVE persons and those who were found necessary to have a further E.C.G. check up were advised to do on the spot.

Surgical check up was done in SIXTY EIGHT cases and the deserving patients were given treatment and surgical advise and reference notes.

THIRTY FOUR were checked for their E.N.T. problems and were given 3

proper advise and treatment.

'ALERT INDIA' Association for Leprosy Education Rehabilitation and treatment took charge of the Dermatology Department and checked FIFTY EIGHT persons for their skin problems. Out of which THREE cases were found to be positive. They had exhibited the anti - leprosy posters for public information.

THREE HUNDRED AND SIX patients were checked for Ophthalmic problems by expert optician & suitable spectacles with frames were provided on the spot free of cost while the cost price was subsidised by the sponsorers. Guidance was given for patients whose ailment were in advanced stage and required surgery to be done in the hospital.

Screening was done in NINETY FIVE persons out of which ONE was found to be positive. The screening machine in Family Welfare Clinic - cum -Ambulance was used to great advantage.

Blood Grouping was done in ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY FIVE

cases. People were given their respective Blood Group cards Immunisation for typhoid, cholera, triple tetanus toxide and poly FORTY THREE cases and immunisation cards were issued.
