

Due to unhygienic living conditions and lack of proper dring water, they were advised to drink boiled water atleast during the rail season. The camp activity went on till 3.30 p.m. Thereafter all the dode dispersed with full job satisfaction. The public showed their gratitude a expressed their desire that such camps may be held in future and all I public will co - operate in the same way. The sposorers thanked all the st and promised to call on such co - operation in future for serving h economically backward section of the society.
