Our team started from the centre at 8,00 a.m. & reached the site at 9,30 a.m. & carried out the camp activities. Camp was inaugurated by Shri Arun Mehta, Hon ble Minister for Home, Lion T. P. Jain was in the Chair, Prominent members of the Lions Club of Pantnagar along with ladies of Lioness Club & members of Leo Club were also present. The following were the invited doctors:

The following activities were carried out:

Medical, Surgical, Gyranec, E.N.T. and Paediatric cases were examined by Dr. H. V. Pophale, Dr. B. R. Kherdikar, Dr. S. M. Ladhawalla and Dr. (Mrs.) Taranekar. About ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY persons took advantage of this department and the deserving patients were given proper advise and were sent to the nearby hospital for further investigations and treatment.

2. Persons suffering from Cardiac and respiratory diseases were seen by Dr. H. V. Pophale and E.C.G. were taken in TWENTY EIGHT persons. at nominal cost price of Rs. 10/- to confirm the diagnosis and were treated accordingly. This treatment was sponsored by Dr. S. S. Virdi.

Opthalmic cases were examined by Dr. (Mrs.) Gangar. THREE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN porsons were checked for their eye sight problems and NINETY SEVEN persons were given specs at a nominal cost price of Rs. 20/- per apacs by her team.

* Alert India * took charge of the Dermatology department. They checked TWENTY NINE persons for their skin problems. No leprosy positive case was detected.

Free Blood Grouping was done by our Laboratory Assistants, NINETY ONE persons got their Blood Group cards in plastic covers which would help them in donation and transfusion. This was under 'Know your Blood Group ' free project of The Family Planning & Medical Aid Trust'

Free screening was carried out in Family Welfare Clinic - cum -Ambulance belonging to 'The Family Planning and Medical Aid Trust'. TWENTY FOUR referred persons were screened for their chest problems for their chest problems out of which five cases were found to be abnormal. Cards were given to the people who were screened for their own record.

Free Immunisation was given against typhoid, cholera, triple vaccine. tetanus toxide, polio and measles to SIXTY SEVEN persons including children. They were also given cards for their record mentioning all the relevant details.

8. Exhibition was set up by Smt. Meena Kulkami and the coloured posters were displayed at prominent places.

Drug Distribution: Vitamin A Tablets were given to the children to prevent blindness. Iron and multi vitamin tablets were distributed to anaemic ladies and patients, especially pregnant ladies.


Observation: Although the camp was held during Ganesh festival and heavy rains shower spells, still the attendance was more than satisfactory. It was found that most of the people were hutment dwellers and belonged to low income group. Mostly tobacco was found to be consumed by them. They were suffering from anaemia, arthritis, worm diseases, skin diseases, diahorrea, dysentry and scables. Small children were suffering from night blindness i.e. Vitamin A deficiency and were given medicine for the same. They were also suffering from malnutrition and protein deficiency. The organisers were extremely courteous, enthusiastic and could manage the whole camp very successfully and in a disciplined manner and they deserved admiration. The volunteers did a wonderful job.

The camp ended at 3.30 p.m. in a very pleasing atmosphere and all the people dispersed. The local people requested us to repeat such camps in winter to cover the wide hutment areas around in the future.
