The following investigations were carried out :

1. Medical check - up was carried out in ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY SIX persons and were accordingly referred to different departments and prescribed and given medicines available with us and if not, according to their ailments were requested to purchase from outside.
2. E.C.G. was taken of referred patients, having cardio - vascular complaints and hypertension on the nominal cost of Rs. 10/- per E.C.G
3. EIGHTY FOUR persons were given spectacles on nominal cost of Rs. 20/- per specs and those having eye trouble were prescribed medicines and eye drops accordingly and were given reference note for further surgical treatment to K.E.M. hospital which is the nearest teaching Municipal Hospital.
4. Dental check-up was carried out by Dr. Ritu Waghmode, who examined the dental patients for their problems and treated minor cases on the spot by giving medicines and applying antiseptic lotions and those who deserved further surgical treatment and extractions or

5. cavity filling, were referred accordingly and were advised and given reference chits to the Dental College O.P.D. for further treatment.
5. Screening was carried out in FORTY TWO referred cases, in our 'Family Welfare Clinic - cum - Ambulance' and reports were given free of cost for their record. None were abnormal.
6. SIXTY NINE persons took advantage of our ' Know Your Blood Group ' Project. They were given their Blood Group Cards in Plastic covers free of cost for their use, either for blood donation or receiving blood in emergency.
7. Immunisation was carried out in TWENTY NINE persons, against tetanus toxide and T.A.B. vaccine.
8. Family Welfare exhibition was arranged by Smt. Meena Kulkarni, who explained the workers the importance of small family and distributed condoms among males and oral tablets for their females for spacing the children in the families.

Observations : Being the last day of our four days camp activity, workers from all departments were present for check-up and took active part in the camp and got themselves duly examined and referred to the required speciality.

Most of them were suffering from chest diseases like Bronchitis, Hypertension, Anaemia, Malnutrition, worm infestation, skin diseases, diabetes, water borne diseases like diarrhoea, dysentery. They were treated and prescribed medicines accordingly and explained the preventive measures.

The mill workers as well as management took active interest to make the camp a great success and both the workers and the management were satisfied by the sincere and most useful services rendered by the staff of the Trust.

Thereafter, they bid send - off to all and requested us to give space in their dispensary for two hours on every saturday for family welfare counselling and assistance.
