The following activities were carried out :

1. **Group Meeting :** A group meeting was arranged by Dr. B. R. Kherdikar. He also carried out medical check - up in about TWENTY ONE patients & treated & prescribed them proper medicines and those who require further investigation of screening were told to get it done in our van.

A group meeting was arranged by Smt. Meena Kulkarni, EIGHTEEN women took part in this meeting. She explained them the importance of family planning and requested them to come to our centre at Colaba for further free advise and immunisation of their children.

2. **Screening :** Screening was done in our Family Welfare Clinic cum Ambulance free of cost. Only TWO referred suspected cases were screened but were found to be negative.
3. **Immunisation :** Immunisation was carried out against typhoid, tetanus toxide, triple vaccine and polio in ELEVEN persons including children.
3. **Free Distribution of medicines :** Vitamin A and Folic Acid solution was given to children to prevent night blindness. Iron and Folic acid tablets

were given to anaemic and lactating mothers and pregnant ladies. Minor ailments were treated by giving proper medicines from out stock to the patients.

4. TWO packets of condoms and FOUR packets of oral tablets were distributed free of cost to the eligible couples. (ladies & men) for spacing the children in their family. They were advised to come to our Centre for free counselling of Family Welfare problems between 10.00 a.m. and 12.00 p.m. on any working day.

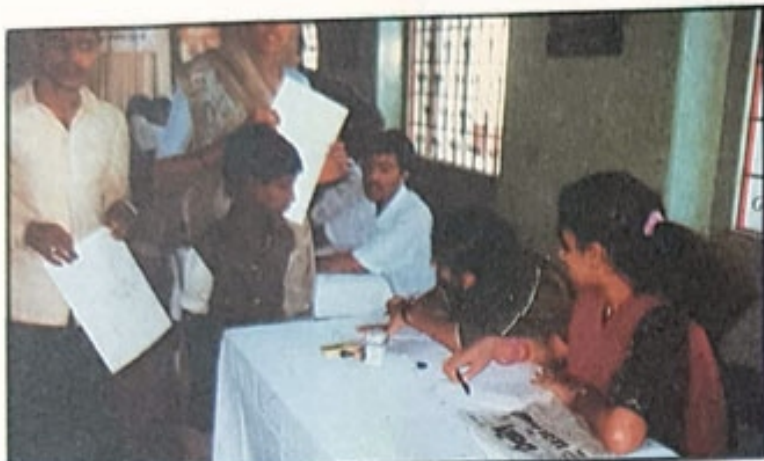
Observation : About FIFTY EIGHT persons took advantage of this minicamp activity. They mostly belonged to economically backward class and were mostly from muslim community and therefore special efforts were made to convey our message of family planning to them.

They were mostly suffering from anaemia, respiratory diseases, skin diseases, arthritis, spondylitis. Children were suffering from scabies, dysentery, diarrhoea, malnutrition and were advised to take nourishing diet, specially milk and egg daily regularly. They were also advised to keep their surrounding clean giving importance of cleanliness to prevent the diseases like malaria, cholera and water borne diseases.

The crowd gave full co-operation and heard our talk quietly. Few more visits to the site will change the attitude and out - look.
