The following activities were carried out in this zopadpatti :

1. Group meeting : A group meeting was arranged by Smt. Meena Kulkarni. This being our second visit few ladies who had missed the last camp participated in it. Smt. Meena Kulkarni advised the women regarding Family welfare activities provided regularly by our trust. Expecting mothers were advised to come to our trust for free ante-natal, post-natal care as well as for sterilisation operation after two children. Lactating mothers were advised to take nourishing diet and do regular check-up of blood pressure, weight and haemoglobin and to get themselves immunised for T.T. accordingly and take all the precaution required to have a healthy and normal baby.
2. Lab. Investigations : Haemoglobin test was carried out in about TWELVE women and children and those who were having low percentage of haemoglobin, were given Iron and Folic acid tablets for two weeks.
3. Screening of chest : Screening of chest was done in FOUR cases in our 'Family Welfare clinic - cum ambulance'. No case was found to be positive.
4. Immunisation : Immunisation was carried out in TEN women, men and

5. children for Tetanus Toxide, Triple and Polio vaccine and Typhoid  
Distribution of Free medicines : Vitamin A solution was given to children by mouth, SIXTY TWO children took vitamin A and folic acid syrup. Anaemic ladies were given Iron and Folic Acid tablets.
6. Family Welfare Activity : TWO packets of oral tablets were given to women who asked voluntarily for it and TWENTY pieces of condoms were distributed among men with instruction to constantly use them.

**Observations :** About EIGHTY persons took advantage of this camp activity. The surrounding area was polluted due to unhygienic conditions. Water had stagnated and so there were plenty of flies and mosquitoes breeding on it which spread diseases like malaria, dysentery, diarrhoea, and also typhoid. They were strictly advised to keep their surroundings clean to save themselves from harmful disease and also request Bombay Municipal Health visitors for fumigation and other possible measures.

Being our second visit we found that no changes had taken place in the surroundings. We requested them to take help of Municipal Corporation and sanitary inspector to render the possible help to keep the surroundings clean by regular follow up to them in their office and request them to solve the problems of this zopadpatti to the possible extent and prevent the spread of harmful diseases.
