The following activities were carried out:

- 1. Group Meeting: A group meeting among EIGHTEEN women was arranged by Smt. Meena Kulkarni. She advised the women regarding Family welfare activities provided regularly by our trust. Expecting mothers were advised to come to our trust for free anternatal check up and T. T. injection and others for post-natal care and for eligible ones for sterillisation surgery. They were advised to take nourishing diet and regular check-up of blood pressure, blood group, haemoglobin and also to get them immunised regularly to have a healthy and normal baby. They were advised to get their babies immunised for B.C.G. & other as per the schedule completely free in our centre at Colaba.
- Haemoglobin Test was carried out in THIRTY women and children and were given iron and folic acid tablets for other ailments they were advised to take proper treatment from their doctor.
- Screening was done in SIX persons, among them two were positive for Broncho Vascular Marking and were advised to take further treatment from their doctor for chronic bronchitis.

- Immunisation for Tetanus Toxide, Triple, Polio and Measles vaccing was carried out in THIRTY persons & children.
- Distribution of Free medicines: Iron and Folic acid tablets were distributed among SEVENTY anaemic and pregnant women. SDCTY FIVE children were Vitamin A & Folic Acid syrup.
- FIFTY pieces of condoms were distributed among men & TWO packets
 of oral tablets were distributed among women for spacing their children
 in their families. They were advised to attend the centre for F.P.
 counselling and E.N.T. application.

Observations: About SEVENTY SIX persons took advantage of this camp activity organised by our Trust through this Mini Camp. The surrounding area was polluted due to unhygienic conditions. Due to stagnated waster, there were plenty of flies and mosquitoes present. People were mostly suffering from malaria, dysentry, diarrhoea, etc. Children were suffering from scabies from which tubes of Gamascab cream was given for external application to the skin with scabies which made them very happy.

They were further advised to take help of B.M.C. health Dept. for furnigation of their surrounding. They also promised to keep their surroundigs clean as much as possible and come for regular ante - natal check - up, immunisation of their babies to our Trust centre at Colaba.
