The following activities were carried out:

Group Meeting: A group meeting was held of about THIRTY EIGHT persons, which was addressed by Dr. B. R. Kherdikar. He carried out medical checkup and the deserving patients were given free medicines available with us and the others were advised to come to our medical aid trust, opp. Regal Cinema, for further immunisation & Family Welfare councilling.

Clinic - cum - Ambulance

A Group Meeting of about TWENTY SIX women was addressed by Smt. Meena Kulkarni. She explained them the importance of family planning &requested them to visit our centre at Colaba, opp. Regal Cinema for further free advise & immunisation of their children & any problem pertaining to them.

Laboratory Investigations: Haemoglobin Test was carried out in EIGHTEEN women & children & those who were having low percentage of haemaglobin, were given Iron & Folic acid tablets for 2

- Immunisation was carried out in TWENTY FOUR men, women & children for Tetanus Toxide, Triple & Polio vaccine & cards were issued on which next due date was mentioned.
- Distribution of Free medicines: Vitamin A solution was given to children by mouth, FIIFTY EIGHT children took vitamin A and folic acid syrup. Anaemic ladies were given Iron and Folic Acid tablets for fifteen days.
- Family Welfare Activity: TWO packets of oral tablets were given to the women who asked voluntarily for it & TWENTY pieces of condoms were distributed among men with instruction to constantly use them.

Observations: About ONE HUNDRED AND TWELVE persons took advantage of this mini camp activity organised by the Trust. The surrounding area was polluted due to unhygienic conditions. Due to stagnated water, there were plenty of flies and mosquitoes likely to spread diseases. They were also advised to take assistance from B.M.C. health Dept., to clear the water pollution & make their surrounding clean by fumigation. They promised to come to our centre for regular ante - natal check - up.
