The following activities were carried out in this zopadpatti :

1. Group Meeting : A group meeting was arranged by Dr. B. R. Kherdikar. About TWENTY FOUR persons were present for this meeting. He carried out medical check up and the deserving patients were given free medicines available with us and the others were advised to come to our medical aid trust, opp. Regal Cinema, for further laboratory tests and screen investigations.

Group Meeting was arranged by Smt. Meena Kulkarni. This being our second visit, few ladies who had missed the last camp participated in

it. She advised the women regarding family welfare activities provided regularly by our Trust. Expected mothers were advised to come to our Trust for free ante - natal, post natal care as well as for sterilisation operation after two children. Lactating mothers were advised to take nourishing diet and do regular check - up.

Laboratory Investigations : Haemoglobin Test was carried out in about FOURTEEN women & children & those who were having low percentage of haemoglobin, were given Iron & Folic acid tablets for 2 weeks.

Screening of chest : Deserving patients were advised for screening to our trust, at Colaba for further investigation and treatment.

Immunisation : As it is the second visit to this site we have given the second dose to the previous patients and first dose to the new patients of triple polio and typhoid.

Distribution of Free medicines : Vitamin A solution and Folic acid syrup was given to FIFTY SIX children. Anaemic, ante - natal and post - natal women were given Iron and Folic Acid tablets for the period of one month.

Family Welfare Activity : THREE packets of oral tablets were given to

the women who asked voluntarily for it & TWELVE pieces of condoms were distributed among men with instruction to constantly use them, and advised to take the suppliment from our Trust, at Colaba.

**Observations :** Being our second visit we found that no changes had taken place in the surroundings. Health authority B.M.C. did not take any action towards the cleaning of surrounding areas so health cannot be maintained as they are the victims of water-borne diseases like gastroenteritis, dysentery, diarrhoea, typhoid and malaria. Then also we advised them to prevent the spread of harmful diseases.
