The camp was inaugurated at 9.45 a.m. by Dr. D. J. Coreea, G. M. The following activities were carried out:

- Médical and surgical check up was done by Dr. Suhas Pophale and FOUR HUNDRED AND FORTY FIVE people took advantages of this
- Physical check-up was done by Dr. B. R. Kherdikar and THREE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE people took advantage of this facility.
- 3. Chest check up was done by Dr. s. S. Virdi and his assistants. ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY SIX people took advantage of these services. The deserving patients were advised to take E. C. G. and screening of the chest to co-relate the clinical diagnosis and were given the treatment accordingly.
- Opthalmic check up was carried out by Dr. (Mrs.) Jayawanti Gangar. Deserving persons were advised to take spectacles. Dr. Gangar personally looked after the check - up and verified the refractions of the


- specs which they have got and also treated the other eye problems.
- Dental check-up was carried in about ONE HUNDRED people by Dr. Rutha Waghmode. Most of the patients having cavities were given medicines for temperory relief and asked to come to our Trust centre at Colaba dental Department and get themselves treated. Many patients were advised to keep their teeth as clean as possible. The main cause of this was tobacco chewing and smoking. They were also advised to give up these habits. For further dental treatment they were advised to continue their treatment from nearby dental clinic.
- 6. Screening of the chest was done free of cost in the 'Family Welfare Clinic-cum-Ambulance belonging to the Family Planning and Medical Aid Trust. About SEVENTY FIVE referred persons took advantage of this service. In which EIGHT cases were found to be positive for T.B. All the persons who were screened were given their record. the T.B. patients were given symptomatic treatment and were advised to attend the T.B. clinic of government hospital or Shivadi Hospital for further treatment and follow up. This screening procedure was carried out by Mr. C. K. Das our X - Ray Assistant.
- Immunisation was done in ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY FIVE children against typhoid, triple vaccine, tetanus toxide and polio.
- 8. Free Blood grouping and Haemoglobin Check up was done in TWO HUNDRED AND SIXTY TWO persons and were given Blood Group Cards in Plastic covers, for their record and using them in emergency either to get get the blood or for giving the blood when such situation arises. Their names and addresses will be entered into the Blood Group Directory in the next edition 1991. Haemoglobin test was done in about SEVENTY FIVE persons.
- Distribution of medicine tablets: Distribution of Iron and Folic Acid tablets to the pregnant and anaemic ladies and also to the anaemic men and children free of cost and advised them to continue the treatment for atleast one month
- 10. Family Welfare activity: The Family Planning exhibition was arranged by Smt. Meena Kulkarni, and she had given the advise for family planning for men and women who are eligible for it. The condom was also given to ELEVEN persons (110 pieces). The pamphlets were also distributed among them and they were happy to know our activities and facilities of standard services.

Observations: About SIX HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE persons took advantage of this camp activity. Most of them were low middle class and dock workers as well as domestic servants. Some of them were organisers

of the camp and their relations. They were also suffering from chronic devises like bronchitis, astama, arthritis, peptic ulcer, anaemia, devises subnutrition, alcoholic and tobacco toxicity.

Necessary instructions were given to the persons diagnosed for Tuberculosis and advised them to attend the Tuberculosis Hospitals out Tuberculosis and advised them to attend the Tuberculosis Hospitals out patients department of Municipal or Govt. hospital and get treated as there patients department of Municipal or Govt. hospital and get treated as there patients department of Spreading the diseases to the relations and small children at is likelihood of spreading the diseases to the relations and small children at home. The infants were advised to take B.C.G. injection at the nearest centre and if not available they can even attend our Free Immunisation Centre on first Saturday of every month, between 11.00 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. at our Trust Centre at Colaba.

At 5.30 p.m. the camp was over and the camp registration was closed at 4.45 p.m. The organisers were kind enough to arrange for lunch packets of good quality to all the staff members & also arranged Tea and snacks at 4.00 p.m.
