On Saturday the 7th December, 1996 a big project was undertaken of 'Pulse Polio' Nationwide Immunisation programme initiated by the Central Govt. and participated by all Governments, Municipal and NGO organisation. The Family Planning & Medical Aid Trust technically assisted "A" Ward in their allotted area 'Geeta Nagar Zopadpatti' and Colaba, Main Centre' between 8.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.

INTRODUCTION :

OPHTHALMIC COUNTER :

This counter was conducted by **Mr. Ajay Kumar Gupta**. About THIRTY TWO persons were examined and advised for the spectacles, EIGHT for short and others for long sight.

IMMUNISATION :

Immunisation counter was managed by **Mrs. Alka Sawant, Mrs. Sharda Parab and Miss Laxmi Das**. About FORTY persons were immunised against Tetanus, Polio, Triple & D.T., and were issued respective Immunisation cards in plastic covers for their record.

LABORATORY INVESTIGATION :

This counter was very well managed by our experienced Lab. Technicians **Mrs. Swati Kadam, Miss. Ila Joshi, Miss. Manisha Shinde and Miss. Seema Thube**. about EIGHT FIVE persons took full advantage of this counter to know their blood group. FOUR persons were found to have Rh negative factor of groups A(3) and one of group O(1). They were issued respective blood group cards in plastic covers

for permanent record.

FAMILY WELFARE EXHIBITION-CUM-COUNSELLING:

This counter was managed by **Mrs. Archana Tawade** Asstt. Family Welfare. She informed to all the attending couples about free Family Planning Advice and distribution of condoms and oral contraceptives to each eligible couples.

OBSERVATION :

About FOUR HUNDRED SEVENTY SIX persons attended the camp. It was noticed that majority of the persons were from middle class and could very well understand and react to the ideas and advices given to them. They all were very much delighted and happy with the medical services rendered and requested to have frequent such camps in future. The management was pleased to provide snacks, cold drinks and lunch to attending Doctors and Staff members at the camp site.

On the whole the camp was quite a success and all dispersed with complete satisfaction.
