The popular film 'Mahercha Aher' was shown to tribal people on request and they appreciated it very much alongwith educative films and at the end of the picture the announcement was also made informing about Sunday Free Multi-diagnostic and Free Multi-therapuetic Health Camp with free availability of required medicines and free spectades to the needy persons of lower sections of the village.

INTRODUCTION:

The students and teachers of the 'Ppst Basic Ashram School', enthusiastically welcomed the Doctors and other V.I.P.'s having the traditional Aarti-cum-Dandia and Lazim dance. The playing Lazim and Dandia in a musical procession was exclusive and very impressive to all the Guests, Doctors and V.I.P.'s.

Dahanu), Shri. B.P. Pawar (Executive Magistrate), Shri. S.B. Gadhawe (Block Development Officer), Dr. Umesh Maknikar (Health Officer), Dr. B.T. Raikar (asstt. Director Animal Husbandry), Shri. V.R. Bhatkar (Administrator Haffkine Institution), Shri. R.L. Phadake (Food & Nutrition Officer), Shri. More (Project Officer), Shri. Anant Tarane (Dy. Surpanch) and Shri. D.P. Gawai (Project Officer) on the dias were honoured by garlands.

Mr. D.P. Gawai (P.R.O. of our Trust) gave a short introduction of the Trust. Dr. H.V. Pophale Chairman "The Family Planning & Medical Aid Trust" spoke about the type of services and requested all to take full advantage. He also requested about anti-addiction of tobacco and alchohol and inspired every student take up leadership in their circle and bring the revolution in the tribal society. After the function tree plantation programme was taken up by Environmental Dept, where trees were planted by Chairman and other important

and prominent members of the gathering. Thereafter all the Doctors went in their special rooms allotted to them and started the work with the waiting crowd of the patients and carried on the examination and treatment.

CARDIAC, MEDICAL & SURGICAL COUNTER:

This Medical Counter was managed by Dr. H.V. Pophale and Dr. S.P. Bhopardikar. About ONE HUNDRED persons were examined by them. The persons who approached with chest disorders were very well taken care by them. The deserving patients were adviced to take E.C.G. and Screening of the chest to corelate the clinical diagnosis and were given the appropriate medicines free of cost from our stock.

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GYNAEC COUNTER:

This counter was taken care by Dr. Suresh Yevle and Dr. Amerjit Kaur from Mittal Hospital. One Hundred Twenty SIX ladies have taken the advantage of this counter. The Ante-natal and Post-natal care was also taken into the consideration in order to avoid unnecessary complications during delivery most of the ladies were suffering from Anaemia and Malnutrition and they were given Anti-Anaemic drugs alongwith Vitamin tablets to restore their proper health from our stock.

OPHTHALMIC COUNTER:

This counter was conducted by **Dr. V.A.** Naware and **Mr. Prasad Gupta. FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY THREE** persons were examined by them for various eye disorders and **THREE** HUNDRED THIRTY SEVEN persons were given spectacles Free of Cost after careful examination.

E.C.G. COUNTER:

This department was conducted by Mr. Babu M.S. TWENTY SIX E.C.G.s were taken.

X-RAY, SCREENING OF THE CHEST:

This counter was also managed by our X-Ray Technician Mr. Babu M.S. single handed. About FIFTY TWO persons were referred in our Family Welfare Clinic-cum-Ambulance, FOUR persons were found Pulmonary Koch's TWO persons

defected Cardiomegaly and SIXTEEN persons were found for increased Broncho Vascular Markings.

LABORATORY INVESTIGATION:

This counter was taken care by our experienced Lab. Technician Mrs. Swati Kadam and Ms. Manisha Shinde. ONE HUNDRED THIRTY NINE persons were examined for their blood group. They were also issued blood group Identity Cards endorsed with necessary details for their reference while donating or receiving the blood transfusion in emergency.

PADIATRIC DEPARTMENT:

This department was well managed by **Dr. B.R. Kherdikar.** About ONE HUNDRED FIFTEEN Children were examined by him for various problems, most of the children were having Malnutrition and some of them were having Spleenomegali. The proper guidance and treatment were given to them alongwith Antianaemic syrup and vitamin "A" solution were also given to them to prevent night blindness.

E.N.T. COUNTER:

This department was taken care by **Dr. Kuldeep Singh and Dr. Swati Kamble. ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY FIVE** persons were examined by them for various problems pertaining to ears by giving the appropriate medicines and ear drops from the stock.

DENTAL CHECK-UP:

Dr. Deepak Satpule, Dr. Girish Patil, Dr. Vibhakar Mothe and Dr. Amrut Salvi were handed this counter. They examined EIGHTY THREE persons suffering from dental problem and also extracted loose teeth and given complete relief.

IMMUNISATION:

This counter was very well managed by our senior Staff Nurse Mrs. Alka Sawant, Mrs. Sharada Parab and Ms. Laxmi Das. ONE HUNDRED THREE persons were Immunised against Tetanus Toxide, Typhoid, Triple, Polio and Measels. They were issued Immunisation Cards for their record and next due date was mentioned to be followed by any other local team of Public Health Care.

FREE DISTRIBUTION OF MEDICINES:

Drugs purchased by the Trust for this project were freely given to the needy people. Medicines for minor and common ailments were also dispenced. Iron and Folic Acid Tablets, Calcium, Multi-vitamin, Anti-pyretic and other Anti-biotic tablets and capsules were given free of cost.

FAMILY WELFARE EXHIBITION-CUM-COUNSELLING:

This counter was managed by Ms. Anjali Rane and Mrs. Archana Tawade F.W. Social Worker. This counter was well decorated with Exhibits and Posters of Family Welfare in order to draw the attention of all the eligible couples. NINETY pieces of Condoms and TWELVE pockets of oral pills were given to the eligible couples on request. The need for planed family was insisted in their understandable language.

OBSERVATION:

About SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY persons took advantage of this Free Health Camp activity. The Health Camp was extremely successful, it was carried out in a very disciplined and systematic way with help of Volunteers of the School. Every patient was seen satisfied with the services. Plastic Carry Bags were given to them for carrying the medicines.

It was surprising to see that even for Blood Grouping and

Immunisation there were long Queues shows awaiking in the Tribal population about Health preservation. The patients were receptive, polite and followed the Queue system willingly and admirabally.

There were many rare disorders and Surgical problems referred district Hospitals and Mumbai Hospitals with our note. The T.B. and Leproscopy cases spotted were handed over to the respective persons from district Hospital who have kindly remain present to assist us.

Tribal persons offered a very limited lunch with Love and Respect which was accepted by all the staff to keep up the conginal atmospher and the camp ended at 2.30 p.m. with an air of job satisfaction and pleasure and all left for Mumbai in their respective vehicles.
