INTRODUCTION:

INAUGURATION:

The inauguration programme was carried out by the hands of Dr. B.R. Kherdikar Medical Officer Family Planning & Medical Aid Trust. The other Members Mr. U.R. Rathod vice Principal, Mr. M.K. Pingle Suparintendent, Mr. Joshi A.J. Group instructor were also present on the dias. Dr. B.R. Kherdikar M.O. then inaugurated the function by lighting the Samai, The visiting dignitories were honoured by giving Bouquet to Mr. D.P. Gawai P.R.O. Dr. Kuldip Singh, Dr. Archana Muley, Dr. Rashmi Gupta, Dr. Swati Kamble, Dr. Amarjit Kaur and other members of the I.T.I.

Mr. A.J. Joshi from I.T.I. gave an introductory speech to know the various activities of I.T.I. and the importance of taking such camps for the benefits of workers. Mr. D.P. Gawai P.R.O. explained in details the objective of the scheme for Urban & Rural population through mobile Audio Visual van with the help of Medical and para medical staff of Family Planning & Medical Aid Trust. Dr. B.R. Kherdikar in his speech gave details of the investigative facilities that were available to the members attending the camp. He requested them to attend the immunisation counter and to clear the doubts whatsoever existing in their minds. He stressed on the subject immunisation because prevention is better than cure. He also asked them to check their blood group the other facilities available were to know your blood group which is necessary to every individual at the time of emergency like roadside accidents. E.C.G. and screening from our Family Welfare Clinic cum Ambulance. He then asked them to avail facilities like E.C.G. & Screening of the chest from Family Welfare Clinic cum Ambulance.

MULTI DIAGNOSTIC MEDICAL SURGICAL AND GENERAL CHECKUP COUNTER:

This multidiagnostic counters was very well managed by our team of Doctors who were lead by Dr. B.R. Kherdikar, Dr. Kuldeep Singh, Dr. Archana Mulley, Dr. Rashmi Gupta, Dr. Swati Kamble and Dr. Amarjeet Kaur about THRÈE HUNDRED THIRTY FOUR persons took advantage of this counters the persons who approched with chest disorder were well diagnosed by Dr. B.R. Kherdikar and were directed to the respective counters. Accordingly the deserving patients were advised to take E.C.G. and Screening of the Chest to co-relate the clinical diagnosis and were given the prescription

according to their complain put forward.

E.N.T. COUNTER:

This E.N.T. Counter was well managed by Dr. Kuldeep Singh and Dr. Swati Kamble, The best available method for diagnosis and treatment was given to each patient. Latest techniques and modern equipment was used to solve the problems pertaining to ears. SEVENTY TWO patients took the best use of this counter.

GYNAEC COUNTER:

This counter was very well taken care by two lady doctors Dr. Archana Muley and Dr. Rashmi Gupta they examined SIXTY NINE lady patients with the problems forwaded to them. All the patients were examined in a special room provided to them for Gynaec examination separatly. After examination all the patients were given prescription to purchase medicines from the nearby chemist. The anaemic ladies were given Iron & Folic acid tablets which were supplied to them free of cost.

SCREENING OF THE CHEST:

The screening of the Chest was done in the Family Welfare Clinic cum Ambulance van as the X-Ray machine was kept in the van itself EIGHTY FIVE patients were examined by Mr. Babu M.S. our X-Ray technician and cards were supplied to them to show to respective Doctors for further live of treatment.

E.C.G. :

This counter was well managed by Mrs. Mary Thomas and she reported FIFTY FIVE persons after taking E.C.G. to consultant Doctors for their opinion and further presention from them. This was given on the graph paper in prescribed format.

IMMUNISATION:

This was managed by Mrs. Sushama Thomas, Miss Lata Gade and Miss Laxmi Das. They immunised about ONE HUNDRED SIXTY one for Tetanus, Polio and tripal. Each patient were given immunisation cards for their record.

LABORATORY INVESTIGATION:

This counter was managed by our technicians Miss. Ila Joshi and Miss. Seema Thube. They examined blood group of about ONE HUNDRED FOURTY NINE persons their and gave them blood group cards in plastic covers for their reference while donating or receiving the blood in any emergency.

FAMILY WELFARE EXHIBITION CUM COUNSELLING COUNTERS:

This counter was well managed by Miss Anjali Rane and Mrs. Archana Tawade. All the eligible persons visiting to their counter were advised to take either condom or oral pills to space the children after one or two issues. The children
